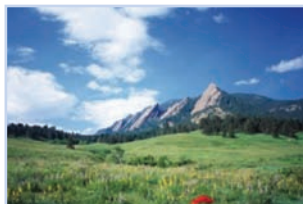


## Bolder Boulder Celestial Seasonings, Dushanbe Tea House & Pearl Street Mall Tour

Boulder lies against the foothills with the gorgeous Flatirons rock formations as its backdrop. The campus of the University of Colorado at Boulder also resides in this city. On the way to Boulder you will drive through one of the nation's most breathtaking sights, Red Rocks Park and Amphitheater. Amidst towering cliffs slanting upward, huge red sandstone rises hundreds of feet above you. The rock formations flank the amphitheater providing excellent acoustics and a stunning frame for Denver's city lights.



A must-stop for Boulder is the Pearl Street Mall. Enjoy browsing the many exciting shops in this vibrant historic preservation district that serves as the town's heart and center. Year round, the downtown pedestrian mall provides a living stage with a host of characters, plenty of good dialogue and even drama provided by the strollers, shoppers, storekeepers and street performers.



A true cultural treasure, the Boulder Dushanbe Teahouse was a gift from Boulder's Tajikistan sister city, Dushanbe, as a sign of friendship. **Enjoy lunch at this community treasure.**

Next enjoy a Celestial Tea Experience. Tour the factory, art department, research and development labs and see how the beautiful little boxes of naturally delicious tea are made. Then browse in the Tea Shop and Emporium.

## Molson/Coors Brewery Tour

In lieu of a golf tournament this year we are offering a tour of the Molson/Coors Brewery.

On the way to the Coors Brewery, discover the exploits of the Old West's most famous character, Buffalo Bill Cody when your bus arrives atop Lookout Mountain. The museum contains antique guns, costumes, posters and memorabilia from his Wild West show. Cody's grave site offers sweeping views of Denver and the plains.

Then it's off to Molson/Coors Brewery, where America's finest-quality beers have been produced for more than 120 years. The visit includes a walking tour through the malting, brewing and packaging processes, an opportunity to sample Coors' superior beer and a visit to the company gift shop. **(Proper ID is required for sampling.)**

### Georgetown “Silver Queen of the Rockies” Historic Western Town and Shopping Tour

Georgetown is a spectacular journey back in time. The town began as a camp for prospectors who were attracted to the gold discoveries of George and David Griffith. Gold was not found in great quantities, but for more than two decades Georgetown rode the crest of the silver boom. In 1893, the town started deteriorating and by 1939 even the railroad was dismantled. A National Historic Landmark District, this quaint little town is filled with meticulously restored buildings, vintage architecture, fine restaurants, shops and galleries where you can shop, shop, shop.

Legendary Louis Dupuy, one of Georgetown’s early citizens, loved the mountains yet longed for reminders of his home in France so he built the Hotel de Paris to share his origins with the people and visitors of Georgetown. The Hamill House, a Country Gothic Revival-style mansion, was built in 1867 and was once the home of one of the area’s richest mine owners. Both are on the National Register of Historic Places. You’ll have time to explore historic Georgetown, shop, and visit either the Hotel de Paris or the Hamill House.
