Know that when you invest in AWCI, AWCI will invest in you and our industry.




AWCI Introduces New Logo

AWCI created a ceilings task force to guide the association's work in meeting member needs regarding ceilings. The group of ceiling contractors, suppliers and manufacturers reviewed AWCI's current and past activities in this area and defined several short- and long-term activities to pursue over the next several years.


AWCI Partners with EIMA

AWCI CEO Mike Stark accepted an invitation from the EIFS Industry Members Association to join EIMA's new education/workforce development working group. The group's goal is to link four program working groups, each aligned with industry initiatives, with the goals of EIMA's strategic plan.



Training Program

AWCI participated with the National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) in updating an existing training program on the installation of gypsum board. Twice-a-month meetings were held throughout the year to complete the project. AWCI provided three subject matter experts.



ASTM C840 Update

The ASTM C11 Committee on gypsum board and related products started a process to completely update ASTM C840 on the installation of gypsum products. AWCI was part of a collaborative work group tasked with providing input for the new document.



Gypsum Recycling

AWCI joined and participated in the Construction Demolition Recycling Association gypsum committee. Their monthly meetings have a goal of promoting and training on the recycling of gypsum. Initiatives also included a review of and comment on technical papers on the subject published by the University of Florida.



ICC Participation The International Code Council started the process to draft an additional standard on off-site construction. AWCI

participated in the early meetings and monitored the standard's development.

New White Paper Published

AWCI published a white paper on exterior cement plaster and rainscreen assemblies. This was done as the result of a recent building code change that requires that rainscreen assemblies be incorporated into cement plaster applications in certain climate zones.

AWCI brought occupational safety and health professional Pete Chaney on board to help the association further develop its member safety services, resources and other safety initiatives. Chaney brings more than 35 years of safety and health experience to the association, including recent work as executive director of safety, health and risk management at the Mechanical Contractors Association of America.



In May 2022 AWCI submitted comments to OSHA concerning a proposed rule to revise its forklift safety standard. AWCI's concern is what employers could be required to do to demonstrate adequate design and construction of trucks manufactured before the effective date of the final rule. AWCI made it clear that contractors must be permitted to rely solely on the lifts' manufacturers for that information.



AWCI submitted comments to OSHA concerning a proposal to change its rule addressing the recording and reporting of occupational injuries and illnesses. Specifically, AWCI expressed its opposition to any requirement that would result in public access to any affected company's contact information, and/or making any company's injury illness information accessible to the public online.



AWCI presented a safety webinar on why the construction industry is moving away from hard hats in favor of helmets. The webinar included video of tests performed on both hard hats and helmets demonstrating the differences in structural integrity. The speaker was topic expert George Stallings of Sales Solutions, Inc.



AWCI also presented a webinar on suicide prevention in construction. The association wanted to highlight this topic because the suicide rate for construction workers is the second highest of all industries. The speaker was Stuart Binstock, president & CEO of the Construction Financial Management Association, which founded the Construction Industry Alliance for Suicide Prevention.



In August 2022 AWCI performed a Peer Safety Review at South Valley Drywall in Colorado. The review team evaluated job sites and the company's fabrication shop, along with pertinent documents. The team reported the results of the review to the company's leadership on the final day of the review, and made recommendations to further enhance the company's safety performance.



AWCI presented a Safety Roundtable at AWCI's Industry Leaders Conference where discussion resulted in the development of 10 action items, including providing a set of lessons learned from AWCI's first two peer safety reviews and establishing ways for AWCI members to learn what other trades are doing to successfully improve occupational safety and health.



AWCI presented an educational session at the fall conference on OSHA's impact on wall and ceiling industry construction firms. Participants were encouraged to closely monitor several regulatory items, including forthcoming changes to OSHA's standards on hazard communication and lead, and an impending new standard on heat illness prevention.




This year 26 participants completed AWCI's Project Manager Development Series. To date, 242 people have earned the AWCI-PM credential.






